FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Students & friends.

Last Monday, the 29th of April was a busy day for staff as they engaged in a number of professional development sessions aimed at improving the effectiveness of MNAC teachers. The day started with a session on programming for the new syllabuses presented by our Board of Studies Liaison Officer, Mrs Jennifer Michaliski. Other sessions covered a number of areas, including, Gifted and Talented (GATS), Student Tracking, Student Welfare, A New Look at Homework, Supporting Struggling Students & Explicit Teaching.

Half Yearly exams are scheduled for weeks 4-6 this term. Year 7, 8 & 9 students will be sitting their exams in week 4 and Year 10 & 11 students will be sitting their exams in weeks 5-6. These exams will take place in the school hall under exam conditions.

Students usually receive written exam notifications that detail the date and time of exams as well as the topics to be examined. In the lead up to week four, students usually have few in-class exam revision sessions giving students many opportunities to ask specific questions about particular areas or topics. It is therefore crucial that all students are now engaged in regular study for exams in all subjects.

Parents are asked to support their children during this time by monitoring the time set aside daily, including weekends for exam preparation and to check if their child has the right text, subject booklet or revision notes that would be used for exam revision. In the interest of student safety, we ask all parents to support the College rules for End of School Day. These basic rules or procedures aim to ensure students safety as they get picked up by parents at the end of the school day. Currently, a number of students leave the school gate and navigate their way precariously through the maze of moving and stationary cars towards the corner of the school Hall, where they wait unsupervised and exposed to possible strangers coming through the car park after 3:20pm. Other students take similar risks, following pre determined arrangements with parents to meet them at our next door veggie outlet (Fred's). Few other students use the same dangerous path in their way out of the school to catch their usual West Bus or to walk home.

We ask for your cooperation so that from next Monday 13th May, the supervising teacher at the gate will allow students to leave the gate if:

- a parents comes to the gate to pick up the child:
- a car driven by a parent stops momentarily to pick up the student;

Students who take West Buses will be allowed to leave school grounds from the Office side of the College. Other students will not be allowed to leave the school gate. At 3:10pm, the school gate will be locked and remaining students will be moved to the undercover area opposite the Library, where they can be seen (not supervised) by staff, while waiting to be picked up by parents.

Parents or guardians are reminded that school is officially closed at 4:00 pm and that teacher supervision stops at 3:10pm.


