Afterwards, they were taken on a guided tour of the museum, paying particular attention to the children's section. Students were able to observe real life artefacts from the holocaust as well as documents, photographs and clothing, many rescued from concentration camps. A long bus ride completed our adventure and a lovely day was had by all!


