From the Schools Chaplain

On behalf of His Beatitude Mar Meelis Zaia, I would like to welcome you back to another year at St. Narsai Assyrian Christian College. I would also like to welcome the new staff members, new students and our beloved parents. We thank God for a successful 2013 and I pray that our Lord Jesus Christ continues to bless our School community with many more blessings for 2014.

Two days ago we held our first Eucharistic service for this year, in my sermon I mentioned about the reasons and importance of one of our compulsory fast Rogation of the Ninevites (Ba'utha d-Ninwaye). This fast is observed for three days and for this year it commences on the Monday10th of February 2014. The first reason we observe this fast is to commemorate the repentance of the Ninevites by the preaching of Jonah (Old Testament).

The second reason for this rogation to be observed is at the time of Mar Sawresho Metropolitan-Bishop of BeitSlokh in the 6th Century, there was a pestilence (deadly epidemic disease), which is called in the world "the plague", which took place in our lands. It came about because of the multitude of men's sins, almost consuming and bringing to an end all the men of BeitGarmai, of Assyria, and of Nineveh. When Mar Sawresho prayed to God because of the rod of wrath which was destroying his flock he heard the voice of an angel saying, "Proclaim a fast and make petition, and the pestilence will be removed from you." At once this holy man commanded that the people observe a Fast. On the final day of the Fast the people had fellowship in the Sacrifice of the living Body and holy Blood of Christ, and by it were pardoned and sanctified. Indeed, utterly none of those into whose bodies the corruption had spread died, not even one.

This Fast is observed by either of these two types 'Absolute Fast' or 'Partial Fast'.

Absolute Fast – Person refrains from both food and water for 3 days.

<u>Partial Fast</u> – During partial fasts the faithful abstain from eating anything that comes from animals e.g. No meat, dairy, eggs etc. Only food that comes from the earth is permissible.

Three ways in which faithful observe the partial Fast;

Fast absolutely from dusk till dawn or after the Evening Prayer (5pm). After the evening prayer, you may eat one meal of foods that are permissible in a Partial Fast.

Fast from dusk until the Mid Day Prayer (12pm). Thereafter you may eat food that is permissible in a Partial Fast.

Eat throughout the day, but only the foods that are permissible in a Partial Fast.
