FROM THE DEPUTY

Dear parents, students and friends of the college

While we acknowledge the vast majority of our students for meeting the College expectations in relation to attendance, a number of students continue to disregard these expectations. This is despite the fact that we have raised this important matter with a good number of parents during three Information Evenings in the last three-four weeks.

Unfortunately, these students are putting themselves at risk of failure to complete their courses. Lateness to school is considered partial absence and will contribute to the total number of absence days for the student. Lateness to class causes unnecessary interruptions to lessons and class time, which negatively impacts on classroom learning. On Tuesday, I had a brief meeting with most of these students and explained the importance of school attendance.

Warning letters will be sent to some of these students' parents in order to alert them about the risks associated with poor school attendance. Parents of students with high rates of absences are asked to discuss this important issue with their son or daughter and try to find a solution to this problem.

Focus on literacy

The College staff continue to focus on improving literacy for all our students. Teachers are including more literacy based learning activities in their daily teaching routines in an effort to support students in developing their own literacy skills. We ask that parents support their children by encouraging them to develop a love and passion for reading. As a general rule, students should set time aside every day for reading. This is because developing good reading skills contributes to better phonemic awareness, vocabulary, comprehension and writing skills, which are essential ingredients to academic success.

Student Tracking

Next week our teaching staff will complete the final touches on compiling student tracking data for years 7-12 for 2014. Based on the collected data I will be working on developing cross college strategies to extend high performing students and to provide support for low performing students. I will also endeavour to contact parents of low performing students or students who are at risk of failure to lay down a plan of action, so together, parents and teachers can collaborate to provide opportunities for these students to develop important and necessary academic skills that would result in improved student outcomes.
