Our *condolences to Rev Shamuel* and his family in the loss of his father in Canada. Our prayers and thoughts are with you and your family.

Special prayers (organised by Mrs. Mary Khina- Religious Coordinator) were held in Pastoral Care periods to commemorate *Ascension Thursday (25th May)* celebrating commemorate the Ascension of Jesus, which is one of the seven Holy Feasts in the Church. The Ascension is the departure of Christ from Earth into the presence of God. The Ascension took place 40 days after the Resurrection of Jesus. In Acts chapter 1 we read that in the company of the disciples, Jesus is taken up in their sight after warning them to remain in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit. The College celebrated *Mother's Day* with a brunch at Nineveh Hall. It was a great success with over 300 attending. The event raised around \$1000 which has been sent to the Breast Cancer Appeal. A big thank you to the Committee that organised the brunch. The Parents and Friends Committee was also involved and many thanks Rima Bejain all the other mothers and friends for their assistance during the day.

The *College cross country* was held in Week 4. It was very successful and the participation amongst students was quite high. The weather was quite good for it and a very enjoyable day was had by all. Many thanks to Mrs. Victoria Tatian, PDHPE coordinator, and her faculty for organising the event.

The Athletic Carnival this was held last Friday, 2nd June. It was well attended by students and participation was very high. FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Guardians and Friends,

Semester One assessments for Years 7 & 8 students were completed this week. Some Years 9 & 10 subjects will be conducting half-yearly exams next Tuesday (week 7), followed by Year 11 Half-yearly exams from next Wednesday.

Year 11 students will be allowed to leave the College at the end of their daily exams to allow them time at home to revise for their next day examinations. Alternatively, students are welcome to stay at the College after their exams and study or use the time for last minute consultation with their respective subject teachers. Where students have no exam for the day, they are not required to attend the college.

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It is that time again, where year 10 students receive information and advice about Year 11 subjects or courses on offer in 2018. This process will start next week with in-school sessions delivered next Wednesday, 7th June by KLA Co-coordinators and subject teachers explaining and promoting a wide range of Year 11 subjects. This will be followed by a Subject Information Evening for current Year 10 students and their parents at 6:00pm on Tuesday, 13th June in the college library. This is therefore an opportune time for year 10 parents to start a discussion with their child about what subjects to consider for their HSC course in 2018. Students will be notified later about next steps in this process.

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You may already know that we have established a Study Club at the college that operates from 3:05 to 4:00pm every school day in the college library. The purpose of this club is to give students the opportunity to access teachers after school hours and receive individual support and guidance in relation to homework, assignments or assessment tasks and any other academic endeavour.

Students have access to computers in the library as well as other resources. Students may also make prior arrangement with specific subject teachers for personal or individual assistance. At this time, students wishing to attend the college study club, must ask their parents to give permission through a note in the student diary.

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Most Year 11 and 12 students have at least one or more Period Zero a fortnight/ cycle. Period Zero starts at 7:50 am and it is treated as a normal period by the school. Unfortunately, a number of students are either not attending this period regularly or are coming late to this period. Both these practices are unacceptable and may prove damaging to students' academic prospects long term.

Students are urged to attend all their allocated Period Zero's on time and apply themselves with diligence to all learning activities in their respective classes. A number of consequences will apply to all students who breach known school policies in relation to attendance. These range from after school detentions to issuing N Warning letters. Teachers have been asked to take the roll within the first five minutes from the start of the lesson as is the case with all other periods.

FROM THE HEAD PRINCIPAL

It is my pleasure to write to you as the new Head Principal of St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School and St Narsai Assyrian Christian College.

My appointment is a result of discussions between His Beatitude the Archbishop of the Sydney Assyrian community and the Independent Schools sector, AISNSW. The purpose of the appointment is to lead and monitor a whole school development process with quality teaching and improved student outcomes as the primary focus.

As the Head Principal I will initially work closely with the AISNSW review team to examine the structure and efficiency of current leadership positions and formulate a series of recommendations to the College Board to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of both instructional and organisation leadership across both schools.

The capacity of senior management to lead teaching and learning is key to improving student academic performance and strengthening the reputation of the College in the Assyrian community, and beyond. The position of Head Principal was deemed essential to ensure the forthcoming recommendations are successfully implemented.

To assist staff, parents and students understand more, I provide a brief overview of my professional background in education. I have wide ranging experience across Independent Schools in Australia with previous leadership positions in Schools in NSW, South Australia and Victoria. In addition I have taught in New Zealand, the United Kingdom and for 3 years in Amman, Jordan as the Deputy Principal of Amman Baccalaureate School. I loved my time in the Middle East and will utilise my knowledge and experience from that time in this position.

Over the coming weeks I will continue to meet with staff, particularly those in leadership positions, to gain a better understanding of this unique school. In addition I am visiting classes to observe the student learning process along with monitoring the process and procedures of the school.

From the original vision of His Beatitude, the growth and development of both schools has been phenomenal. As we look forward to the opening of the new site for St Narsai Assyrian Christian College next year it is timely to ensure that this unique school continues to grow and prosper for the good of the students, staff, parents and the Assyrian Christian community. As the Head Principal, I am excited to be working with the Principal's, Mr Aldo Rufo and Mr Sargis Makko to ensure this occurs.

I thank each one of you for the warm welcome I have received.
