


Science Faculty: Year 11 Biology Field Trip

Friday 23 June, saw forty intrepid Year 11 Biologists, with Ms Nanoa, Ms Mathew and Mr Yager, travel to Narrabeen Environmental Centre for their ecosystem study. Larger than expected wave activity forced a change of venue, so we trekked out along the headland. On top of the whale watching hilltop, we paused to take in the spectacular views of the Northern Beaches before descending to the rock platform.

As soon as we hit the sand, students were engaged by the variety of shells from once living animals accumulated along the shore. However, the real treat awaited us in the shallow pools and rock crevasses of the tidal rock platform. It was low tide but a few soggy shoes resulted from the occasional surprise wave. Students searched the water to find limpets grazing on algae, barnacles closed to the drying sun, snails hiding under the shade of rocks, and starfish hunting along the pool bottoms. The occasional scurrying crab brought students running.

Thermometers and salinity meters came out to make measurements of physical abiotic characteristics along a measurement tape while surveys of living creatures were used to try to explain why animals live where they do.

Overall, it was a very enjoyable day and I saw our students alive to the wonders of nature. However, the most memorable moment was as we entered the Environmental Centre and the teacher employed to guide us said to me, "I had forgotten how nice your kids are!" Well done St Narsai and thank you for a great day.





Science Faculty: Year 10 Luna Park Excursion

On the 16th of June year 10 visited Luna Park as part of their Science curriculum, which allowed the students to explore the world of physics. Students braved the cold and ventured out early morning to the city as they congregated at the exhilarating entrance of Sydney's favourite centre for fun and physics. Students started the day with a quick tour of all the rides, revising their knowledge on what physics concepts the rides were built on. The rest of the day was a blur of rides, including The Wild Mouse, The Hair Raiser, The Spider, The Rotor and The Power Surge, to name a few. Students worked through their 'physics is fun' booklet as they investigated gravitational acceleration with the Hair Raiser, centripetal force with The Rotor, inertia with Dodgem City, and energy conversions with the tumble bug. All in all, it was a fantastic day that allowed students to see the real life application of the laws of motion that they had spent the term learning about.
