Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

The curriculum team has commenced a process of evaluation and self-reflection in relation to student outcomes in semester One 2015. Teachers are engaged in a process to understand current student achievement levels and how achievement levels have changed over time for all our students, including IEC students.

Staff continue to use improvement targets identified in the college's Strategic Management Plan (SMP 2014-16) to guide their work across many areas, including student outcomes.

During yesterday's college assembly, I encouraged all students to reflect back on their semester one achievement and invited them to ask questions in their classes and seek support from their teachers. I also emphasised that students should consider exceeding their potential and achieving better results for the second half of the year.

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Year 12 students will be sitting their HSC Trials Examinations next Monday. These exams will continue for nine school days, until Thursday 6th of August. We wish our Year 12 students all the best and pray that they perform well in these exams and achieve great results.

Where students have no scheduled exam for a day, they are permitted to stay at home and study for the next exam. Students are also permitted to leave school at the conclusion of the morning exam if that is the only scheduled exam.

Message from the Counsellor

Acting on Unconscious Thoughts

The teenage phase of all adolescents is an interesting study; the way they grow and their transition from a child into an adolescent is quite extraordinary. Continuing onto my second year journey as the counsellor at the College feeds my curiosity in this transition.

The cherry on top of my journey is the exposure I receive when I accompany different grades at their camps and excursions, as it so happened last week with the year 9s at the Cataract Scout Camp and this week's Athletics Carnival at Prestons.

Throughout these encounters inside and outside of school, I witness these 'children' and their gradual (sometimes spontaneous) transition into an adolescent/teenager.

With boys, you have the sporty group that put all their effort in their physical presentation that encompass their appearance and results in what has become known as a *chick magnet*. On the other hand, you have the *nerdy* computer fanatics that love their video games, movies and cartoons – the type that concentrate more on technology then the efforts on impressing the opposite gender, and vice versa with the girls.

It is these characteristics of the students that further confirm their social status and presentation, which in return presents side effects which may be positive or negative at times.

This concept of social appointment reminds me of a study that took place decades ago. The day after the assassination of Martin Luther King, teacher Jane Elliott decided that she wanted to help her third-grade students understand the consequences of being different (minority) in a group or society.

She split the group into those with blue eyes and those with not. She declared that blue-eyed people were superior and treated that group accordingly by being more relaxed about discipline with them, giving them longer recess times and paying them more attention. The other children were ordered to sit at the back of the class and were treated harshly.

The most staggering part of this experiment was the fact that by the end of just the first day massive changes had already taken place. The blue-eyed children who had been previously struggling started to perform better and similarly the smarter brown-eyed kids were all of a sudden struggling.

Not only that, but the blue-eyed kids soon started to taunt the others and gloat. Elliott was wise enough to flip the exercise after the first day to give both sides the opportunity to understand what it feels like to be treated in such a manner.

As parents/teachers, unconsciously we often pay more attention to the brighter child, the cuter child, the sweeter child. Little do we know that the more we act upon this unconscious thought, the more the minority groups suffer. Let's act consciously and better the well-being of all our children.
