As it is the start of another School year I wish to take this opportunity to welcome you all back, I hope you had happy and relaxing holidays with your children.

I wish to bring to your attention some points that we are concerned about and hope that you can cooperate with us and support our policies and procedures;

- Lateness to school..... it is your responsibility as parents to make sure your child is at the school by 8.40 am every day, you must make every effort to bring your child to school on time
- If you wish to pick up your child early, you must write a note and send it to the office in the morning, this note will be sent to the year advisor who will sign and document it.
- No one is allowed to pick up a child from school unless the name of that person is written in the enrolment application as an emergency pick up. If you can't pick up your child then you need to nominate someone else to do so. This is a legal requirement.
- Any student turning up to school without proper uniform will be sent home to change, if there is a problem with uniform then you need to write a note, sign it and send it to the Office to be forwarded onto year adviser
- We will not tolerate hair styles that do not comply with our policies and procedures described in the student diaries. All students have been made aware of this so parents must respect school policies and abide by the rules
- Please make sure you actively supervise your child's study habits and the use of electronic devices and gadgets. Any cyber bullying of any kind will be reported to the authorities
