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Welcome Back to Term 4!

Year 12 students are now sitting for their *HSC exams*, which began on 16<sup>th</sup> October. The students have been are well prepared by their teachers and we know that they have been consolidating their learning and ready for the major exams. Our prayers are with them and wish them good results.

We welcome to our College a *new Deputy Principal*, Mrs. Mary Ismail who has come to us from Cassula High School. We now have two deputies, Mrs. Ismail and Mr. Dinkha. # FROM THE DEPUTYS

### Dear Parents, Students and Friends,

The 2017-18 Year 12 Assessment Information Evening took place in the college library earlier this week (Monday, 16<sup>th</sup>) and important HSC course assessment information, NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) assessment requirements and school based assessment procedures and protocols were discussed. Students who attended this presentation were given a copy of the current HSC Assessment Information Handbook that included all relevant assessment information, including assessment schedules of all subjects offered at the college.

As most Year 12 students would have received their assessment notifications for this term by now, I urge Year 12 students to make a concerted effort to work on their assignments or assessment tasks at this early point in the term. It is crucial that students commence their assessment work early and manage their *Check Point(s)* effectively to ensure they benefit from teacher's feedback on the *Check Point(s)*. I remind students that typical Year 12 students spend between 2-3 hrs every day at home studying, revising, summarising lesson notes, practising exam type responses and working on assignments. Students are also urged to use their school based study periods effectively and use it to consolidate their classwork.

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There is a renewed emphasis on students arriving at school on time. We would like to enlist the support of all parents to ensure that students arrive at school on time before 8:40. A note was sent home last week about this very important issue. Students who continue to come to school late without good reasons will face immediate consequences.

Year 12 students were issued with a new SNACC Senior Agreement this morning by our new Deputy Principal, Mrs. Ismail. This agreement covers college expectations of students in all areas. Please read this document with your child and feel free to contact the College to discuss any part of this agreement.

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All 7-10 students will sit End of Year examinations later this term. This year's End of Year Examinations will take place as follows:

Years 7, 8 & 9 will commence in week 6- From 13<sup>th</sup> November Years 10 will commence in week 7- From 20<sup>th</sup> November

In the next 2-3 weeks, students will be issued with Examination Notifications and Examination Revision sheets to assist them in their preparation for this very important assessment event. The results of these examinations as well as results from other previous assessments will be used to formulate the End of Year Reports.

# FROM THE HEAD PRINCIPAL

We were proud to welcome an SBS television crew to St Narsai and St Hurmizd this week. SBS are very interested in the Assyrian Schools and in particular the journey and growth of the schools as a fulfilment of the vision of His Beatitude. It is a wonderful and heartfelt story which we should all be proud of.

The SBS crew interviewed staff and students and took footage of students in action. The program will feature as part of the normal SBS news broadcast on either Saturday or Sunday night. When we have more details we will let all families know.

This week I attended, with the Deputy Principal from SHAPS Benjamin Khoshabeh, a workshop on School Improvement run by the Association of Independent Schools (AIS). This reaffirmed the new direction we are undertaking at the Assyrian Schools following the whole school review. The critical aspects to improvement relates to 6 key areas which we are making excellent progress on.

Data – collecting and analysing all aspects of student learning, student wellbeing, staff profiles and family profiles to ensure we are on the improvement journey

Professional Learning of Staff – providing opportunities for staff to improve their skills through collaboration and learning from each other

School priorities – making these visible and clearly expressed. For us the priority is quality learning for staff and students.

Action plan – the Leadership team and the staff have been actively involved in framing our 2018 focus areas Capacity building of staff – this includes building the leadership skills of all staff and especially the leadership team

Critical friend – having an external expert (AIS) reviewing the School Improvement process and assessing our progress to ensure we remain on track

A key aspect of the School Improvement process includes the role of parents to support all aspects of the Assyrian Schools. This is an area we must continue to grow and develop.
