By now many Year 9 and 10 students would have received their exam results. Next week, Year 7 and 8 students will start receiving their own exam results. I take this opportunity to congratulate all students who have achieved great results in this final assessment event of the year and ask other students to reflect back on their effort and their study commitment throughout 2013.

The results of these examinations will form a significant part of the final mark for every subject. Teachers have already started their semester two reports, which will show final grades covering all subjects.

Year 11 grades now available (A Message from the Board of Studies)

For the first time, Year 11 students will be able to access their Year 11 grades from Students Online website. From **Wednesday 13 November** students should be able to use their Board of Studies student number and 6 digit PIN to access their eRecord, which will show their 2013 Year 11 grades and their 2012 Year 10 grades. Students must activate their account first to see their grades.

Generally, a RoSA (Record of School Achievement) credential or a Transcript of Study will be mailed to students whose schools have notified the Board that they are leaving school.

ESSA is a state-wide Science assessment program based on the NSW Science Years 7-10 Syllabus, which mandates the teaching of science in contexts that assist students to see the relevance of science and to make meaning of scientific knowledge, understanding, skills, values and attitudes. School Events-Year 8 Excursion

On Friday 8th November, all of Year 8 along with Ms Nona, Ms Theodorou and Ms Isaac headed off on an excursion to Calmsley Hill City Farm in Abbotsbury. Year 8 have been learning about geographical issues that affect the world and in particular an in depth look at the issue of threatened habitats and how we can practise ecological sustainability. The Calmsley Hill Farm has a dry rainforest which is an example of a threatened habitat. We took off in the morning and arrived at the farm where we met our tour guide Noah. Noah took us on a 2 hour walk around the farm where he explained the sustainable use of the farm that he carries out. He then took us through the dry rainforest where the students learned different ways that this threatened habitat can be sustained so that it lasts for years to come. All teachers were very proud of their behaviour and the way all students assisted and cooperated with one another during the walk. 
