
have a full time employment or attend TAFE on a full time bases.


Thanks to all parents who have enrolled their children in our school, we have completed all the interviews and written to all parents confirming their children's acceptance for 2014 school year.

### FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

### **Dear Parents and Friends**

The Year 12 2013-2014 HSC course commenced last week and a number of teachers have already issued assessment tasks to their students. The vast majority of these assessment tasks will be due by the end of this term. It is therefore crucial that Year 12 students start their HSC journey on a positive note by working consistently and efficiently, both at school and at home. Students are expected to spend between 2-4 hrs every day studying, summarising notes, practicing essay writing, working on assignments, etc.

To support efforts in improving the student achievements, we will rigorously follow up on every absence and/ or lateness by our HSC students. Only legitimates reasons, such as illnesses or serious incidents will be accepted by our staff.

Values

During yesterday's Year 12 Assessment Information Evening, students received the Year 12 Assessment Information Booklet. This booklet contains all relevant assessment protocols and procedures as well as assessment schedules covering all subjects.

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As we move to week three of this final term of the year, students (Years 7-10) are reminded that as they complete current assignments or assessment tasks they should prepare early for end of year exams in the next few weeks. Students should also be making sure that all their book work and revision notes are complete and up to date.

Congratulations to all students who achieved great results in the 2013 NAPLAN tests. Staff are currently undertaking analysis work on the College's 2013 NAPLAN results so we can prepare for an appropriate action plan of improvement for next year. Specific students with certain literacy and numeracy weaknesses will be targeted for support and assistance soon.

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A number of students across 7-10 continue to ask teachers to leave the classroom to drink water and to go to the bathroom. Despite raising this issue with our students a number of times this year, this remains a problem. High School students are expected to be able to manage their recess and lunch time efficiently and appropriately so there is no need to interrupt the teacher and the lesson as they seek leave out of class. I ask that parents discuss this issue with their child to ascertain whether or not their child is amongst this minority and to provide advice to him/her if that is the case.



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# From the School's Chaplain

17<sup>th</sup> of October marks the 37<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Consecration of His Holiness Mar Dinkha IV as the Catholicos Patriarch of the Assyrian Church of the East.

- H.H. Mar Dinkha IV was born in the Assyrian village of Darbandokeh located in the sub-district of Harir, North of Iraq in 1935.
- The Catholicos Patriarch was ordained as a Deacon in 1949 and a Priest in 1957.
- He was consecrated as Bishop of Tehran, Iran in 1962 by His Holiness the late Mar Eshai Shimun Catholicos Patriarch.
- His Holiness was consecrated to the Apostolic See of Seleucia-Ctesiphon as Catholicos Patriarch of the Assyrian Church of the East on 17th October 1976
