We have been informed that the release of the 2013 NAPLAN student reports will be delayed until next month. The following is a message from ACARA about this issue:

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) has advised of a delay in the national distribution of NAPLAN student reports to schools. ACARA identified an error in the placement of the national average marker in the Year 5 and 7 NAPLAN student reports for Language Conventions. ACARA is devising a strategy to address the issue, which will delay the distribution of student reports to schools.

It is anticipated that the 2013 NAPLAN student reports will be delivered to schools across Australia from 8-11 October 2013, with distribution of the reports to parents to occur in the week Monday, 14 October to Friday, 18 October 2013.

Office Announcements



In recent times, there has been a significant spike in the number of students arriving late to school. This is a very serious matter and needs to be addressed immediately by all stakeholders.

This is a friendly remainder that the school warning bell rings at 8.25am. The purpose of the warning bell is to give students the chance to go to their lockers and collect what they require for periods 1 & 2 and make their way promptly to their Pastoral Care (PC) class.

The school bell rings at 8.30am and it is expected that all students be in their PC class to begin school. It is strongly advised that parents/guardians drop their

kids off at school between 8–8.20am, to avoid running the risk of students being marked late against their record. From next week, the main school gate will be closed by 8.25am.



Adding to this, Centrelink provide payments to some parents who have children of school age to assist in their educational needs. These Centrelink payments have requirements that the students are expected to satisfy and punctuality is a major criteria.

Centrelink will now be notified of any students with irregular attendance to school. Students whose parents receive Centrelink benefits, may see a deduction in their payments. To avoid this situation, we ask all parents and guardians, again, to bring students to school promptly on or before 8.20am.

Year 7 Excursion


Nicholson Museum and the IMAX Theatre




