Dear Parents, Guardians and Friends,



### Assyrian Memorial Day



### FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of the College

I would like to welcome the College community back to Term 3. This will be a busy term, particularly for our HSC Students as they complete their final schooling term. With the recent health issues in the wider community, I pray that our College community remains safe and we complete Term 3 as normal as possible.

#### **HSC Trial Examinations**

The Year 12 Trial Examinations will commence on Monday 17th August and conclude on Monday 31st August. All Year 12 students will return to normal classes on Tuesday 1st September. Students have been given a timetable of exams and should be prioritising their studies based on the timetable.

As published in the last newsletter, I have included the timetable for the exams again below. Please make note of these and spend time with your child discussing their readiness for each test.

The safety of our students and teachers is paramount. This year, exams will be spread out more than previous years to ensure the safety of all in the exam rooms. We continue to conduct daily temperature checks, thoroughly clean all classrooms and offer sanitiser. We ask that students that have flu like symptoms to remain home.

If your child is sick, please contact the school the morning of the exam. They will be required to complete an illness and misadventure form and attach a medical certificate on the day they return for their next exam. We will reschedule an alternative exam when they return.

Year 8 began the term with a film depth study. They are building upon film technique analysis gained in Year 7. This coming Thursday (6/8/20) we will be commemorating the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord Jesus Christ, which is one of the seven Holy feasts in the Assyrian Church of the East. It is on this day that Christ revealed His divine glory on Mount Tabor in Galilee. After revealing to His disciples that He would be put to death in Jerusalem, Christ, along with Peter, James, and John went up the mountain. There "He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light" (Matthew 17:2).

During Thursday's roll call, there will be a reading and prayer through the PA system. Please have students paying attention and listening to the message spoken by our year 9 CRC student, Meera Buttrus. Also, we will be having a prayer service conducted by our College chaplain, Rev Father Shamuel at recess in FG.03, all are invited to partake in the service.

An excerpt from St. Ephraim the Syrian on the Transfiguration of our Lord and God and Saviour, Jesus Christ:

He led them up the mountain to show them who the Son is and whose He is. Because when He asked them, 'Whom do men say the Son of man is?' They said to Him, some Elias, others Jeremias, or one of the Prophets. This is why He leads them up the mountain and shows them that He is not Elias, but the God of Elias; again, that He is not Jeremias, but the one who sanctified Jeremias in his mother's womb; not one of the Prophets, but the Lord of the Prophets, who also sent them. And He shows them that He is the maker of heaven and earth, and that He is Lord of living and dead. For He gave orders to heaven and brought down Elias, and made a sign to the earth and raised up Moses.

May the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord be a blessing to all.

# Latest COVID-19 case locations in NSW

### Information as at 29 July 2020

Confirmed COVID-19 cases are associated with the following locations. This information will be updated if further locations are identified. Locations are removed when 14 days have passed since the last known date that a confirmed case was associated with the location.

Self-isolate and get tested immediately

If you have been to any of these locations during the time and date indicated you should:

- immediately self-isolate until 14 days after you were last there
- get tested even if you have no symptoms
- watch for COVID-19 symptoms and get retested should any symptoms recur
- even if you get a negative test, you must stay in isolation for 14 days (this is because it can take 14 days before you may show symptoms or test positive).
