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Science Faculty



As we approach the end of the last term, it is a great opportunity to reflect on what has been a busy and fruitful year for both staff and learners alike. Term 4 has already consisted of a variety of academic activities and initiatives to ensure active engagement for our learners and opportunities for them to achieve their personal best.

This term the department commemorated and celebrated a few events;

National Geography Awareness Week- whereby students participated in geography based activities, trivia and guessing competitions

Remembrance Day- commemorated with a one minute silence and presentation during Roll Call NAIDOC Week- presentation remembering the significance and contribution of ATSI to history and culture. Further, Our year 7 learners have been stepping into the shoes of historians to learn and develop an understanding of the ancient past. They have learnt historical investigation skills as well as focusing on a study into Ancient Greek societies and how those societies have shaped our lives today with their introduction of democracy and the Olympic games. 














Learning Support Unit

An inclusive school is one in which children with disabilities and special educational needs are included in the educational arrangements made for the majority of students. Inclusion is the development of strategies that seek to bring about a genuine equalisation of opportunities and that all children should learn together.

The Learning Support Unit at SNACC assists the school to cater for those students in regular classes who are experiencing difficulties in basic areas of learning. The LAST and Teacher's Aides, working with the executive and staff, play an essential part in the whole-school approach to provide for these students. The fundamental role of the Learning and Support Teacher (LAST) and Teacher's Aides is to ensure that all children with additional needs are catered for in the mainstream school. This includes gifted and talented students.

The Learning Support Unit has continued to hold meetings with parents to discuss their child's Individualised Learning Plan and review the details of the support and progress. It is important that we maintain a collaborative effort when planning and implementing strategies that will assist our students in achieving their outcomes. Collaboration includes LSU staff, parents, classroom teachers, the college counsellor, Year Advisor and the students themselves. Collaboration has proven to be extremely successful to support students in their learning.

Term 4 has included Yearly Examinations for Years 7-10, where Learning Support staff have continued to provide provisions for each student in their care. This includes providing readers, writers, small group supervision, rest breaks and extra time. Provisions allow learners the adequate processing time that will enable them to access the information and effectively respond to exam questions. Students have been working hard at school and home with plenty of revision. One week of exams left to go!

The Gifted and Talented team is currently working towards collecting evidence for a Project Based Investigation. Students selected a topic of their choice to investigate and created four guiding questions to aide them in their research. This activity is an independent, student-centred task that requires learners to manage their time accordingly, work effectively in a group, and present their investigation in an interactive exhibition to the school. The topics range from unsolved mysteries, conspiracy theories and scientific inquiries. We look forward to seeing their final presentations!

Finally, as the Learning Support Co-ordinator, I would personally like to thank Mrs Abeer Haddad, Mrs Jenny Hatzisavvas, Mrs Nora Dawod, Mrs Anna Andry, Mrs Lina Francis and Ms Lynn Middlebrook for their hard work, dedication and commitment to our students. They continue to support each learner, with care, compassion and patience. They have put together a Wild Minds Wall of Fame in the Learning Support room that is covered with student work samples, in acknowledgement of their assessment achievements this year.

We look forward to seeing parents in the future, and in maintaining our collaborative efforts with the whole school community. God bless.
