#### NAPLAN Online 2021

Next week, all Year 7 and 9 students will be completing NAPLAN tests from Tuesday 11th May to Friday 21st May 2021. These online tests will provide helpful feedback on student's literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for all students to progress through school and beyond. These tests cover reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. Students are expected to be at school every day of the tests to ensure that they complete them on the designated day. A letter with the details of the tests was sent to all parents of Year 7 and 9 students last term and published in the previous newsletter. The NAPLAN tests timetable has been republished below.

As the tests are online, please ensure that your child brings their wired headphones or earphones with them. Please note that wireless headphones or earphones will not work. Airpods or Bluetooth devices will not be sufficient. Therefore, wired headphones or earphones (with 3.5mm plug) are needed for NAPLAN tests. You can purchase the wired earphones or headphones from supermarkets or department stores such as Kmart. Examples of them are in the images below.

#### Half Yearly Exams and Reports

#### **SCIENCE FACULTY**

Dear parents/guardians,

This term promises to be a fruitful and an exciting one for Science. Firstly, we welcome Ms. Nimmi Varghese to the Science team, a passionate and enthusiastic teacher with industrial experience. Ms. Varghese replaces Ms. Anh Le. We thank Ms. Le for all her efforts and her commitment with the students. She will be missed!

Students across all grades have commenced their new units for the term and activities across have been organised catering for various year groups. As part of a depth study, Year 11 Biology students will travel to the North Narrabeen Rock Platform. They will study the ecosystem in a variety of ways including participating in sampling techniques in order to compare the species diversity.

Year 7 will be treated to an incursion, 'The Chemistry Show', in May. Students will be presented with engaging experiments and demonstrations that will explain how models, theories and laws have been refined as scientific evidence has become available. These concepts will also align with the NSW syllabus, further aiding their studies.

The Big Science Competition is being held in May and St. Narsai will be taking part in it. Every year, Australian Science Innovations organises the Big Science Competition for high-school students to participate in. The Big Science Competition is a 50-minute, multiple choice competition testing critical-thinking and problem-solving skills, not just factual recall. Questions are set in real-life, contemporary contexts, making them relatable and interesting. The competition provides a rewarding opportunity for students to extend themselves beyond school Science through a challenging exam. We encourage students across year 7-10 to sign-up. It is not too late to do so, with registrations closing the 7th of May. Students can speak to their teachers if they want to register.

We hope to see a growth in passion and excitement for Science across the school as we continue providing opportunities for students to extend themselves and see the work of Science around them.

#### **ENGLISH FACULTY**

Term 2 is always a very busy time of year. For Year 7 and 9 students, their term is made even busier with the annual NAPLAN online testing, taking place in Weeks 4 and 5. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. On its own, NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for and students are not expected to do so. As a college, however, our teachers ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and provide appropriate support and guidance.

Within our English classrooms, our lessons are designed to build the literacy skills assessed in the NAPLAN test. Our focus for 2021 is to improve the reading comprehension abilities of our students. As such, all year 7 and 8 classes are starting the CARS & STARS program this term. This comprehensive reading program allows students to identify comprehension strategies to improve their understanding of written texts.

The strategies covered include;

- Finding Main Idea;
- Recalling Facts and Details;
- Understanding Sequence;
- Recognising Cause and Effect;
- Reading Pictures;
- Comparing and Contrasting;
- Making Predictions;
- Finding Word Meaning in Context;
- Drawing Conclusions and Making Inferences;
- Distinguishing Between Fact and Opinion;
- Identifying Authors Purpose;
- Interpreting Figurative Language; and
- Summarising.

The CARS testing supports the information we gain from NAPLAN results, allowing students and teachers to identify strengths and areas of improvement on an individual basis and therefore tailor content and approaches accordingly. Students who are reading for pleasure in their free time are also working towards building their reading skills.

You can support your child by encouraging them to read for pleasure at home. It is also important to reassure them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and remind them on the day to simply do their best.

In the Selective Stream class we have been creating a 3D version of an airplane for TAS. This airplane is made from balsa wood and was our term long assignment for the class. This assignment was crucial as it taught us physical labour skills and gave us a sense of trust and responsibility when we were using the equipment. We also made our own airline which included brochures, tickets, advertisement and even our company's own logo and name which we individually designed. We were introduced to using Canva and developed our ICT skills throughout this project as well. We all had different and unique ideas for this assignment and I thoroughly enjoyed the experience.





#### Christian Studies Creation Project presented by Sally Esttaifan:

Last term for Christian Studies we learnt about God's creation of the world and the importance of each of the six days of creation. Each student chose a specific day of creation and showcased it as a diorama, representing features of creation such as Adam and Eve, the animals, the seasons, vegetation, etc.

#### Geography Endangered Species Posters presented by Fiona Bizhn:

For Geography last term, we were given an extension task that allowed us to research and create a poster on any endangered animal of our choice from around the world. We learnt about why species are becoming endangered and strategies to help endangered animals.

Overall, the Selective Stream have definitely pushed themselves and participated in numerous extension activities across the term. A massive congratulations to Fiona Bizhn who came first, and Arbella Warda who came second, in the Term 1 Selective Stream points system. The point system has now restarted for Term 2 and I am looking forward to seeing these students extend and challenge themselves across throughout the year.
