HSC Exams

HSC Exams commenced on Tuesday 9th November and will conclude on Friday 3rd December. All exams are taking place in Building B in a Covid Safe way. Students are screened for any COVID symptoms before they enter and asked to sanitise. They are required to keep their masks on for the duration of the exams.

I commend all year 12 students on their resilience and perseverance through this unpredictable year. Now that their English exams are complete, I wish them the best as they focus on the exams to come.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Students from year 7 Selective Stream and Year 9 Information and Software technology Class have volunteered to take part in the Australian Astronaut Challenge as an additional extension program.

The students attend a live meeting on Friday with the Presenters for this challenge which include guests from the Australian and international Space sectors, such as Ted Tagami who is the education chair for the International Space Station's US National Lab.

The Students are apart of a team of astronauts creating a family home outpost (FHO) on the Moon. They will be challenged to survive, thrive and solve the problems that astronauts face, by conducting an experiment, designing a device or an environment that can help them grow food on the Moon.

Students will use the iSTEM engineering design thinking process to complete the challenge and present a video that showcases their solution at the end.

In a disrupted world, Year 12 students have shown incredible resilience in adapting to the ongoing challenges presented by the events of recent years.

For several of our students, their hard work throughout the past 2 years has already paid off with 15 of our students already receiving an early offer for their tertiary studies from Western Sydney University, and many others receiving early offers from various other universities.

Some universities and tertiary admissions centres have systems in place that allow them to accept early applications, select students and offer them a place on the course they've chosen before the end of year exams have been sat and ATAR results published.


Congratulations to our students who have received early offers thus far and we wish all our students the very best as they complete their HSC exams.

One offer round using Year 11 results remains open for Western Sydney University with the closing date on 28th November 11.59pm. The results for this round will be released on December 9.

We encourage all students to check their eligibility and apply, free of charge, via the Western portal: https://www.westernsydney.edu.au/fu ture/study/application-pathways/hs c-true-reward We would like to remind our new Year 12 2022 students if you have been getting outstanding academic achievements in Year 11 and term 1 of Year 12, or you've been involved in community engagement (e.g. volunteering), or you've been recognised by your school as a future leader, then you could be eligible to apply for early entry.

If it's something you're really interested in applying for, but you're unsure if you'll meet the criteria, it's definitely worth doing some more research, individual programs may have different requirements that you will be able to apply for.

We wish them all the best in their HSC exams!


















