We extend our best wishes to our Year 12 2023 students and pray that they will be rewarded for their efforts during their HSC exams that concluded today, Friday, 3rd November 2023. We look forward to this year's HSC results that will be published on the 14th of December 2023.

Congratulations to Year 11 2023 students for completing the preliminary HSC course requirements last term and good luck to all of them as they commence their Year 12 HSC 2023-24 courses this term.

On Thursday, 12th October, the college hosted the 2023-24 Year 12 Assessment Information Evening for the new Year 12 students and their parents in building F. I reminded students that typical Year 12 students would need to spend 2-3 hrs every school day at home studying, revising, summarising lesson notes, practising exam type responses and working on assignments. I also emphasised that students should attend early to all assessments tasks as all are equally important and have impact on their final HSC mark.

Mrs. Khina (Deputy Principal- Curriculum) presented attendees with important HSC course assessment information, NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) assessment requirements and the school-based assessment procedures and protocols. Students who attended this presentation were given a copy of the current HSC Assessment Information Handbook that included all relevant assessment information, including assessment schedules of all subjects offered at the college. Students were also issued with a Year 12 Senior Student Agreement and both students and parents signed this agreement, which is a way to hold students to account in relation to meeting the college's academic high expectations.

I wish to announce that we are finalising Year 7 2025 enrolment interviews for current Year 5 students and their parents over the next 3-4 weeks. It has been lovely meeting Year 5 students and their parents during enrolment interviews last week.

I urge other Year 5 parents to contact our friendly office staff for relevant details so they too can secure a placement for their child at St. Narsai College in the 2025 intake.

Parents interested to enrol their child into Year 7 2024 may apply, but they will be put on the waiting list.

I welcome all parents and students to the last term of the year. With the end of the academic year approaching, and with only 7 teaching weeks left before the last day on Friday 8th December, all teachers are busy preparing their students for end of year tasks.

Yearly Exams and Reports

Students in Years 7-10 have already started preparing for their final assessment tasks for the year. Students will be receiving their yearly exam timetables this week.

Please discuss with your child the upcoming tasks that they have. Providing them with a quiet area and time to study and prepare for their final assessment tasks and exams will benefit them to achieve their full potential.

Homework Centre

Our library is open every morning from 7.45am with staff available to assist students with homework tasks and assessments. It is also a great opportunity for students to access study resources and books.

After school tutorial sessions are also available every Wednesday and Thursday afternoon from 3pm-4pm. Please encourage your child to attend these sessions to seek assistance from the tutors in areas including literacy/numeracy or homework help.

HSC Exams

HSC Exams are continuing and will conclude on Friday 3rd November. We continue to wish our Year 12 students all the best with the remainder of their exams.

Literacy and Numeracy

One of the priorities of the College is to improve students' literacy and numeracy skills. We are working with all students in all classes to ensure that they are meeting the required literacy and numeracy skills for their year group. Students in Years 7-10 have been given online work on Maths Online, Mathletics and Lexia to complete in class and for homework. Please discuss with your child the amount of work they have completed on both programs. It is essential that students bring their devices to class everyday so that they can utilise these programs and other online classwork.

NAPLAN tests for Year 7 and 9 students in 2024 will take place on 13-25 March. Even though there is no specific preparation for the tests, students can complete online practise tests through Mathletics and Lexia as well as online through the website www.nap.edu.au.

Year 12 2024

The Year 12 class of 2024 have now commenced their HSC coursework. An information evening was held for all students and their parents with details provided about the HSC coursework and assessment policy. Please discuss the contents of the assessment handbook with your child to ensure that they are prepared and following the course requirements. I wish all students the best as they commence the last year of their schooling career. Academic workshops will be held on a fortnightly basis to assist students with study techniques and strategies.

We are currently finalising the timetable for 2024. By Week 6 this term, students currently in Years 8 and 10 will find out which of their preferences they received and will study next year.

Strategies to support young people to manage stress

Stress is a normal part of life and can help young people feel more alert, increase their concentration, provide more energy when needed and enhance their sensory experience. All of this can be motivating – for example, when they are studying for an exam.

There are many physical experiences of stress that are different for all of us. These may include increased sweating, dilated pupils, increased respiration (quick shallow breathing) and having an unsettled stomach. A degree of these physical experiences is normal and OK.

When we experience too much stress it can feel overwhelming. If a young person is finding they can't concentrate, they are sleeping too much or too little, or are feeling overwhelmed, it can be a sign that the level of stress they are experiencing is becoming problematic. It's at this point that young people can benefit from support from their parents, teachers or a health professional.

School expectations – school arrival times

Parental support is needed in maintaining College expectations.

We ask that students:

- Arrive on time to school. The roll call warning bell is at 8.25am and students are expected to be at school prior to that time. Period 1 begins at 8.30am
- Attend school prepared for all classes, therefore with all required resources
- to maintain their study routines by continuing to complete their homework and assessments at home.
- Wear the correct uniform as per College Uniform Policy refer to pages 28 to 31 of student diaries (see details below)

We hope that parents mirror the St Narsai College SHARP expectations at home with their child.

Uniform Issues

We're in Term 4 and there are some key aspects of the uniform that still seem to be an issue.

Please note, as on page 30 of the student diary:

Piercings:

Boys are not permitted to have any piercings.

Girls only ONE piercing is permitted on the earlobe. Piercings will be confiscated upon sight and returned only to a parent or upon Year 12 graduation.

Any student who "cannot remove the piercing" will be asked to remain home until the 2nd piercing is removed (this includes if it is 1 piercing located anywhere but the earlobe).

Hair:

Boys: hair is to be neatly cut and maintained at all times - issues arising from this will have parents contacted and the issue fixed within a reasonable time. Extreme breaches/continued defiance will result in students remaining home until the issue is rectified.

Girls: hair is to be TIED BACK. There is no half up/half down.

Natural hair colour only - Hair must not be dyed/ streaked.

Girls - makeup

Not permitted - if girls are found to be wearing makeup they will be asked to wipe it off (foundation, tinted sunscreen, mascara etc are all not permitted)

Continued breaches will result in parent contact and possibly further consequences.

Boys: Facial hair

Not permitted - page 30 clearly states 'cleanly shaven' therefore beards, goatees, moustaches are not permitted. (Students with medical certificates have been told go the shortest they can go). However, I am seeing many students with unacceptable facial hair.

Do not breach the uniform policy and just hope you won't get called out.

Girls' skirts are to be knee-length. A good measurement would be the skirt goes over the knee when seated.

Although these uniform expectations are not new, they continue to be an issue.

PRESENTATION EVENING - BOOK THE DATE





From the Science Department


Dear Parents/Caregivers,


